


Martino Abellana

CURRICULUM VITAE



About Martino

Revered as the Dean of Cebuano painters, Martino Abellana was born on January 30, 1914 in Carcar, Cebu to a family of creatives known for their embroidery, music, and sculpture. He was granted a scholarship to study fine arts in the University of the Philippines Manila, where he came under the tutelage of esteemed artists Guillermo Tolentino and Fernando Amorsolo. The latter's mentorship earned him the moniker "The Amorsolo of the South". Abellana earned international recognition for his paintings, most notably the multi awarded "And Job Was Also Man" (1953).

In the 1970s, he co-founded the University of the Philippines Cebu Fine Arts program alongside contemporaries Julian Jumalon and National Artist Jose Joya. For the next decade, he taught private and college art classes, ushering a new wave of Cebuano artists including Romulo Galicano, Sofronio "SYM" Y. Mendoza, Jose "Kimsoy" Yap, Jr., and Adeste Deguilmo. He died of intestinal cancer in 1988.

Abellana's legacy brings forth the art of the Bisaya to the national stage. Again and again, he defied the status quo dictated by Imperial Manila and the West by perfecting his trademark Impressionist-Classical-Realist Style. His artistic philosophy was guided by the idea of the "Two Polar Extremes and Tensions", which reconciled the Objective and Subjective, the Classic and the Romantic, when they had always been dichotomized. Abellana's liberal use of color animated the distinctly Cebuano subjects he loved to paint, be they in his portraits of the island's most prestigious families or in his watercolors of the working class.

Amid his fame and renown, Abellana was known affectionately as "Noy Tinong", an artist who was at his best when his canvases drew from his family, friends, students, and the lives of everyday people."

Achievements:

- Taught at the Cebu Institute of Technology, University of Southern Philippines, University of San Carlos and U.P., Cebu to fine arts and architecture students.
- Outside of school setting: gave time to teach drawing to children in his home in Carcar during the long vacation; taught and inspired talented men and women,among them Sofronio Mendoza, Romulo Galicano, Jaime Gonzales, and several others who spent time with Abellana in his home to learn the rudiments of painting.
- Left a numerous legacy of art works: portraits, figure paintings, seascapes and landscapes, abstract paintings, studies and sketches done in different mediums: oil, watercolor, pastel, charcoal, pencil, even chalk. Some paintings were done with the use of a pallet instead of brushes.
